



Basic instructions

Expect travel time of 2-3 hours from Morgan Hill

Travel from Morgan Hill to Rio Vista via 101 North to 680North  
Stay on 680 Hwy past the 24 junction Hwy 680 to Hwy 242East to Hwy 4East  
Hwy 4 becomes Hwy 160at the Antioch br.  
Hwy 160 to HWY 12West toward Rio Vista  
Hwy 12 to Hwy 84 to Halls Island.

More Detail

From Morgan Hill travel north on Hwy 101  
To Hwy 680 North

Note: 680 is not marked on this map

North on 680 through Walnut Creek past  
the Hwy 680 & 24 Junction Stay on 680

Do not take Hwy 24  
continue on 680 to Hwy 242 East  
Take Hwy 242 to Hwy 4  
East toward Stockton

Note: 242 is not marked on this map  
242 runs from Concord to Pittsburg

If you miss this turn stay on 680 till Hwy 4

Stay on Hwy 4 East to the Antioch bridge  
do not exit the freeway at Oakley just  
the Antioch bridge.

The freeway changes #'s to 160 at the br.  
Bridge toll is \$4

They are building a new interchange here but  
I don't know how done they are.

Cross the bridge and travel to Hwy 12

Turn left onto Hwy 12

Cross the Rio Vista bridge into Rio Vista



At the far end of the bridge,  
take the offramp  
to the right. It is before you enter Rio Vista.  
The offramp sign reads Ryer Island Hwy 84

Travel along the water front to the Ferry  
Cross on the ferry, it is free

Upon leaving the Ferry turn left.



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Travel North on Hwy 84 till you reach Hall's Island. (about 5 miles)

You might see the remains of a large run down barn across the slough on the left and my dock just past it. You may also see a large pontoon boat in the slough.

**This is where people usually get lost**

If you arrive at night( in the dark)  
You will see the lights.

In the day time You can see our sign "HALL'S ISLAND" . Look for the white gates on your side of the river. This is our parking driveway area with gates at both ends.

Stop on the road, honk and wait till you know we see you.

You need to enter through the second gate so that you are facing home again. If you drive past both gates & go about a two city blocks distance and turn around at the junction of Hwy84 and Hwy220. 220 is not marked from this direction. But it is the first real paved road turning to the right that you come to. Turn around and come back to the north gate and stop on the road and open the gate .

The combination to the gate lock is ( call us )  
It is very stiff.

Drive in staying to the left against the bank.
